WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 29, 1993  
 FROST STAYED NORTH AND BULLS HEADED SOUTH BEARS BETTING ON HARVEST PRESSURE. WHEAT TWO CENTS LOWER TO TWO CENTS HIGHER, EXCEPT ST. LOUIS SIX TO NINE CENTS HIGHER. CORN TWO TO FIVE CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM FOUR TO FIVE CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS FIVE TO TEN CENTS LOWER. KILLING FROST LIMITED, AND FURTHER NORTH THAN SOME FORECAST CALLED FOR. OVERALL DAMAGE WAS RATHER LIMITED ON A NATIONAL SCOPE. MUCH NEEDED SUNSHINE OVER A LARGE PART OF THE COUNTRY AND MORE COMBINES EASING OUT INTO THE FIELDS. SUNSHINE NEEDED TO DRY OUT THE GROUND AND TAKE SOME MOISTURE OUT OF THE LATE MATURING SEEDS. EXPORT ORDERS FOR CORN AND SOYBEANS CONTINUE TO BE A DISAPPOINTMENT FOR TRADERS AND PRODUCERS. WHEAT TRENDS AGAIN GOING OFF IN ALL DIRECTIONS, BUT NOT AS A ERRATIC TODAY AS THE CASE HAS BEEN MANY TIMES THIS SPRING AND SUMMER. OFTEN 50 TO 60 CENTS PRICE CHANGES FROM DAY TO DAY AND EACH MARKET SEEMS TO BE ESTRANGED FROM THE OTHER. WEATHER PLAYED HAVOC WITH PRODUCTION AND

QUALITY THIS YEAR. GOOD QUALITY, HIGH PROTEIN WHEAT SCARCE AND OFTEN \$1.00 PRICE DIFFERENCE WITH ONE PERCENT CHANGE IN PROTEIN CONTENT. AT KANSAS CITY RAIL BIDS FOR ORDINARY PROTEIN HARD RED WINTER WHEAT \$1.50 SPREAD UP THROUGH 14% PERCENT. PRODUCERS HARVESTED WEDDY HIGH MOISTURE WHEAT AND BY THE TIME ELEVATORS FINISHED WITH DOCKS THEY WOULD HAVE BEEN BETTER OFF CLAIMING DISASTER PAYMENTS.
