**READY, SET, FLY!**

From October 4-9, 1909, the four existing dirigible balloons in the United States competed in the first race for this type of lighter-than-air craft. Dirigibles, or airships, differ from simple balloons in that they have propulsive power and both altitude and directional steering control. The race was held at St. Louis, Missouri, where the ships flew from Forest Park and Clayton Road to Kingshighway and Lindell Avenues and returned Lincoln Beachy won first prize of \$1,000, with Roy Knabenshue and Captain Thomas Baldwin as close runners-up. The fourth ship, piloted by Cornwall Dixon, went astray and was carried over the city, across the Mississippi River, and landed in East St. Louis, Illinois.

**TIP OF THE WEEK**

Store uncut garlic in a small open container. The odor will not transfer to other foods.

**EARTHWISE**

Here's a heavier furniture polish than the dusting cloth formula given last week. You'll need 1/4 cup food-grade linseed oil, 1/4 cup vinegar, 1/4 cup lemon juice, and a few drops of Vitamin E. Combine all the ingredients in a glass jar with tight-fitting lid and shake well (you may want to shake it periodically during use, as well). Use a soft cotton cloth to rub the solution into the wood until it's clean and shiny. Thanks to the Vitamin E, leftover solution can be saved and used the next time.

**APPLE PEPPER RELISH**

- 4 sweet red peppers, washed, seeded, and cored
- 5 large sweet onions, peeled
- 6 apples, peeled and cored
- 2 tablespoons grated lemon rind
- 1/2 cup lemon juice
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 teaspoons salt

Coarsely grind the peppers, onions, and apples in a food processor or grinder. Add lemon rind and juice and heat to boiling. Add sugar and salt and boil, stirring as needed, until thick and syrupy (about 40 minutes). Fill hot sterilized jars and seal by covering with melted paraffin.

Makes about 2 pints.

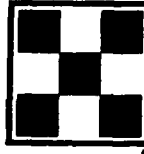

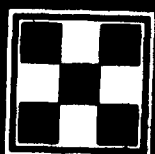
