 USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY EXPORTS BOUYED HARVEST LADEN SINKING CORN AND SOYBEAN MARKET. WHEAT 2-3 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1-4 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 1-3 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS STEADY TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. EXPORT OF CORN TO JAPAN, SOYBEANS TO TAIWAN,

AND SUBSTANTIAL SOYBEAN MEAL TO RUSSIA A LIFEJACKET FOR DROWNING CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES. YELTSEN ATTEMPTING TO STABILIZED THE TURMOIL IN RUSSIA AND THIS COULD FURTHER ENHANCE EXPORT BUSINESS. HARVEST PRESSURE REACHING FULL FORCE, BUT RAINS FORECAST FOR FRIDAY AND OVER THE WEEKEND COULD SLOW THINGS DOWN. A PRIVATE SOURCE LOWERED ESTIMATED YIELDS OF BOTH CORN AND SOYBEANS.
