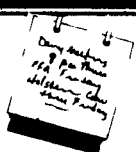

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) — At its first annual meeting, members of the Egg Association of America elected their decision-making body: Dave Baker (Baker Farms), Bob Bucher (Bucher Associates), Toby Catherman (Quaker State), Mel Gehman (LeValle Egg farms), Paul Hann (Purina Mills), Jerry Kil (Southern New England Eggs), Kurt Kreher (Kreher's Poultry Farms), Fran Lough (Dorothy Egg Farms), Glenn Smith (Pennfield Farms), Dale Snader (Dutch Country Egg Farms), Andy Wadsworth (Wegmans Egg Farm), and Paul Wolgemuth, Jr (Green Tree Farm).

The new board, in turn, elected Wadsworth, Baker, Lough, and Gehman to serve as officers, Wadsworth, chairman of the board, endorsed this year's theme, "Progress Through Coalitions," and charged every member with contributing sweat equity toward a "high quality, active association." 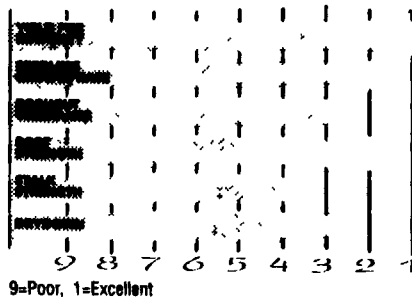

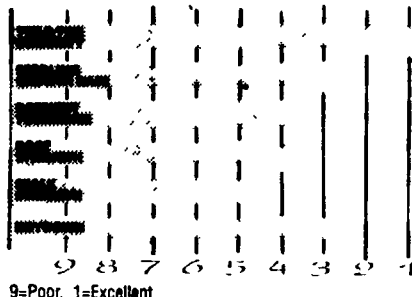

**Management tips:** Widely adapted Excellent top end yield potential under irrigated and favorable conditions Relatively small seed size. Very good resistance to Southern Corn Leaf Blight Average 1st and good 2nd generation resistance to corn borer

**Management tips:** Adapted to varied soil types and weather conditions, but highest yields come from better soils at moderate plant populations Adapted to bean and corn ground Massive plant — excellent silage choice for tonnage, protein & digestibility
