Boneless skinless breasts were irregularly distributed with some larger volumes available at lower asking prices but smaller volumes cleared satisfactorily. The undertone was unsettled. Line run breasts were in fairly good balance with current demand. The few loads offered early this morning were booked at steady prices. Yellow skin leg quarters were no more than adequate for current inquiry but buyers and sellers do not agree on values. Whole wings were tight and the undertone was firm, some smaller volumes of party wings were available.
