On October 21, 1879, Thomas Alva Edison succeeded in producing the first practical incandescent light. After testing literally thousands of different materials over thirteen months, Edison tried a filament of carbonized cotton in a vacuum inside a glass bulb. The OLD FARMER'S WEATHER FORECAST



NORTHEAST: Sunny and warm; cloudy and cool south then clearing and warming.

EARTHWISE

Believe it or not, you can successfully clean your oven without using products that require either a gas mask or opening all the windows and leaving the house for several hours. Before going to bed, sprinkle the bottom of a cold oven with water, then cover the grease and grime with baking soda and sprinkle again with water. Let soak overnight and wipe up in the morning. Use a green "scrubby" pad to loosen stubborn spots. Be sure to rinse and wipe up all the baking soda.



APPLE MUFFINS

- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup oil
- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 apples, peeled and diced

Beat together egg, milk, and oil. Add dry ingredients and mix gently. Stir in apples. Filled greased muffin tins two-thirds full and bake at 400° F for 20 to 30 minutes.

Makes about 12 muffins.
