Weigh conditions of calves and yearlings mostly average to full with normal exception of most unweaned calves which are gaunt. Flesh conditions of yearlings highly varied from thinner types to fat. Bulk of calf supply remains soft and fleshy as is normal for the season. Area wheat pastures continue to excel over past several years at this time. Wheat grazing prospects excellent. Utility slaughter cows \$1.00\$2.00 lower; Cutters steady to \$1.00 higher. Slaughter bulls firm to \$1.00 higher. 825 cows and bulls sold. Receipts this week 8,375; last week 13,623; last year 12,138. Supply consisted of 40 percent yearlings and calves over 600 lbs.; 50 percent calves under 600 lbs.; 10 percent cows and bulls. 


