

Quality 5-Year-Old Takes New Holland Dairy Championship

NEW HOLLAND (Lancaster Co.) — A large 5-year-old Holstein from a Roybrook Tempo sire, which would look "good in any state show you'd want to put her in" according to the judge, was chosen grand champion cow at the New Holland Sales Stables Annual Dairy Show and Sale Wednesday afternoon.

Paul King, Moorefield, W.Va., chose Lydor Tempo Jackie, a cow exhibited by Harold and Donald Welk of Stonehurst Farm, Strasburg, champion of the show. King told the exhibitors and buyers at the start of the sale that the "gal is a big cow" with a lot of show quality. The grand champion was purchased by Harold Fraley, Muncy, for \$3,450. Fraley said the cow was purchased for a farm in Quarryville.

Reserve champion, a 4-year-old Holstein, was exhibited by Jacob Kramer, Mechanicsburg, and Charles Myers, Lancaster. The cow sold to Marvin Miller, Strasburg, for \$3,700.

The grand champion's records included, three years, 13,620 pounds of milk, 541f, 450p and five-year records of 15,260 pounds of milk, 648f, 525p. Dam was Lydor Triple Justene, VG-85, V+EV at five-year record of 19,890 pounds milk, 740f, and

674p. The champion won best udder dry cow.

Show champion Harold Welk attributes the championship to pedigree and feed.

Reserve champion cow was C Bernhaven Haywood Lola, a 4-year-old from a Shaver Farm Haywood-Red sire and Carvale Hurricane Lulu dam. She was selected best udder milking cow.

Of all the classes, top selling animal came from the 2-year-old dry heifer class, Walkerville Roxy Conquest, which sold for \$3,850, exhibited by Stonehurst Farm.

In the mixed breed dry cow class, Danny Albright sold his first place cow for \$2,550. Stonehurst Farm sold the second place animal for \$1,575. Third place shown by Leroy Baker was sold for \$1,325.

In the mixed breed fresh cow class, Ralph Albright sold his first place animal for \$1,775. Second place, shown by Danny Albright, sold for \$1,250. Third, shown by Danny Albright, sold for \$1,500.

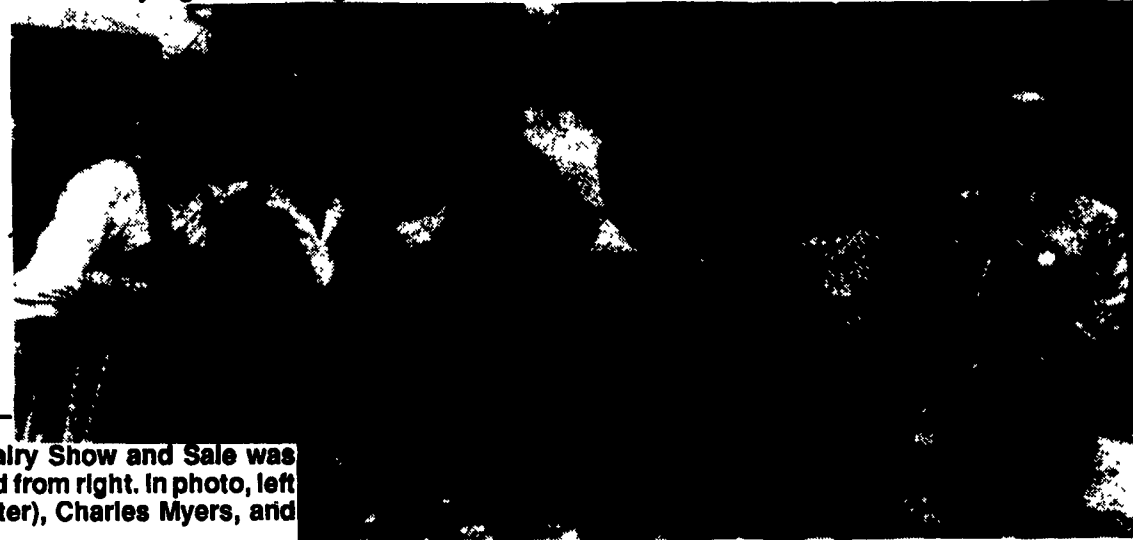

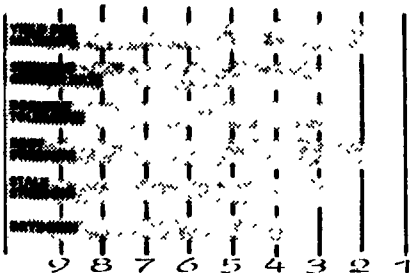

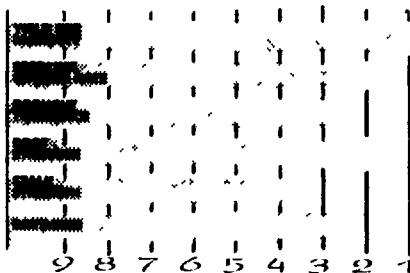

Excellent full-season grain hybrid for northern growers with very good silage characteristics.



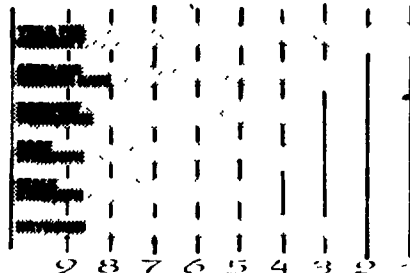

DK 623

Our 111-day yield leader. Produces big yields under a wide range of environmental conditions.

Key traits: Good stalk quality and excellent root strength. Very good stress tolerance. Good early stand establishment and seedling vigor. Medium tall plant with medium ear placement. Medium shank and husk cover. Girthy ear with very good test weight and grain quality. Tied for 1st Place in the 1992 New Jersey NCGA Yield Contest (Class A Non-Irrigated) for Rustin Farms of Trenton with 219.84 bpa.

Management tips: Widely adapted. Excellent top end yield potential under irrigated and favorable conditions. Relatively small seed size. Very good resistance to Southern Corn Leaf Blight. Average 1st and good 2nd generation resistance to corn borer.



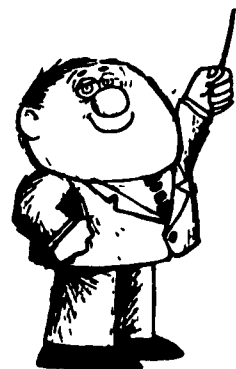

DK 646

Top yielding 114-day hybrid.

Key traits: Contest winning yields. Fast seedling growth rate. Very good plant health. Tall hybrid with medium ear placement. Large ear, excellent ear flex — length and girth. Shows yield well. Excellent ear retention. Took 1st Place in the 1992 New Jersey NCGA Yield Contest for Rustin Farms of Trenton with 209.07 bpa (Class A, Non-Irrigated), and for Richard Tindall of Trenton with 198.02 bpa (Ridge-Roll, Non-Irrigated).

Management tips: Adapted to varied soil types and weather conditions, but highest yields come from better soils at moderate plant populations. Adapted to bean and corn ground. Massive plant — excellent silage choice for tonnage, protein & digestibility
