Processing schedules remained very heavy in spite of some plants trimming operations. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 64 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, leg quarters were in firm hands. Boneless skinless breasts were not as available as earlier. Grade A whole breasts cleared well, but other stocks were ample. Wings were in heavy supply. Increased demand was noted on thigh.
