However, the trade sentiment was firm going into late week. Grade A breasts for retail needs were in fairly good shape at unchanged prices; line run breasts were offered and slow to clear. Most further processors wait for the market to develop before booking late week needs. Leg quarters were well cleared at current prices and the undertone was firm to higher for first of the month retail demand. Wings struggled to clear, and prices trended lower.

Flesh conditions of calves predominately soft, however number of weaned calves increased. Rain needed in western sector of state for wheat growth. Central and eastern areas in good shape with calves starting to be turned out this week however rain welcome. 1200 cows and bulls included in total receipts. Slaughter cows \$1.00-\$3.00 lower; slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand light to moderate. Country demand moderate to good for under 9 year olds and suitable for wheat pasture. Receipts this week 10,925; last week 8,402; last year 9,039.
