AND THE WINNER IS . . .

n November 7, 1876, nobody won the presidential election Although Governor Samuel J Tilden of New York Ucarried the popular vote with 4,287,670 votes to Ohio Governor Rutherford B Hayes's 4,035,924 votes, Tilden was one electoral vote short of the 185 needed to win To resolve the dispute. Congress appointed a special electoral commission made up of five senators, five representatives, and five Supreme Court justices. After nearly four months of deliberation and bargaining, the commission awarded all 20 of the disputed electoral votes to Hayes, giving him the 185 neces-

sary to claim victory. On March 3, 1877, Hayes was declared the winner and new president of the United States
