NEW WINDSOR, Md. — Dr. Lowell B. Catlett, professor of agriculture and business at New Mexico State University, will be the speaker at an agriculture appreciation breakfast to be held on Friday, November 19 as an activity celebrating National Farm-City Week.

The breakfast will be held at 9 a.m. at Wilhelm Catering, Ltd. (formerly Friendly Farms), 1011 Baltimore Blvd (Rt. 140), Westminster, Md. Catlett is a consultant and adviser to the United States Department of Agriculture, Department of the Interior, and the United States Army. With a doctorate in economics from Iowa State University, Catlett teaches and conducts research in the areas of

marketing, policy, natural gas futures contracts, energy futures and options market, management, and futuristic issues.

Catlett is a co-author of several books, including "Farm and Ranch Financial Management," "Cash Flow Management and

Investing in Agriculture Real Estate," and "Investing in Futures and Options Market," and more than 200 reports, articles, and papers.

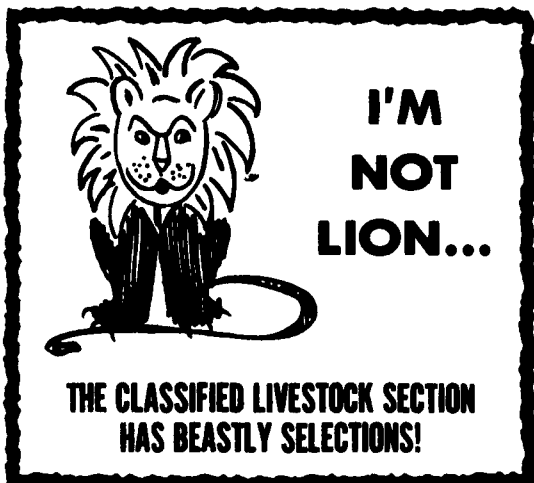
Since 1955, the National Farm-City Council, together with state and local councils and committees, has encouraged an enlightened understanding between rural

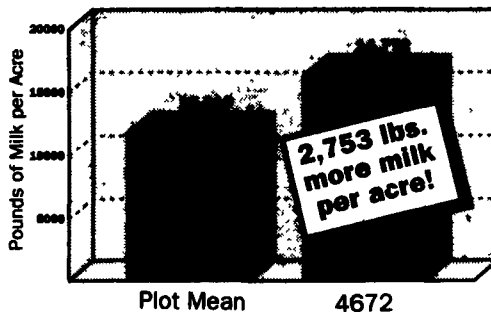

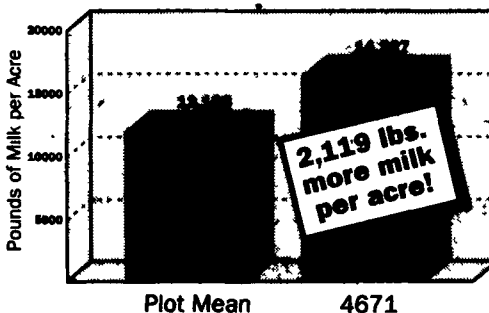
