DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY GOOD EXPORT DEMAND SUPPORTED WHEAT PRICES AND LIMITED DECLINES IN CORN PRICES. PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD AND FAVORABLE HARVEST WEATHER IN THE MIDWEST THIS WEEK, PUSHED YESTERDAY'S STRONGER CORN PRICES LOWER. COMMERCIAL BUYING ON THE BOARD STRENGTHENED BEAN PRICES. WHEAT 1 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT SO. IOWA 5 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 16 CENTS HIGHER. ALGERIA'S SUBSTANTIAL WHEAT PURCHASE UNDERPINNED WHEAT PRICES AND IDEAS THAT RUSSIA WILL SOON BE TENDERING FOR ADDITIONAL AMOUNTS ADDED TO THE GAINS. CORN RECEIVED GOOD FOREIGN DEMAND BUT PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD SET IN AND WEAKENED PRICES. FORECASTS FOR GOOD HARVEST WEATHER IN THE MIDWEST KEEPING FARMERS IN FIELDS BUT EXPECTATIONS FOR LOWER

YIELDS LIMITED PRICES DECLINES. SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED TO CLIMB IN REACTION TO COMMERCIAL BUYING AND ANTICIPATION OF LOWER PRODUCTION ESTIMATE FIGURES.

Quality of calf supply improved and average thru attractive. Calf condition also improved with higher percentage of average to slightly thin short term weaned calves involved in the consist. Cold front pushed thru the state over the weekend with the first hard freeze and a light snow. Wheat pastures in need of rain for growth and this combined with hard freeze to limit calf outlets. Slaughter cows uneven with Utility firm to \$1.00 higher, Cutters \$1.00-\$2.00 lower. Slaughter bulls steady to \$1.00 lower. Packer demand continues light to moderate. Many of the 950 cows sold destined back to country or feedlots. Receipts this week 13,000; last week 10,943; last year 7,992. Supply consisted of 46 percent yearlings and calves over 600 lbs.; 47 percent calves under 600 lbs.; 7 percent cows and bulls. \* () indicate weighted average weight or price.
