THE OLD FARMER'S WEATHER FORECAST



**NORTHEAST:** Rain and cold, then sunny and mild showers north, snow west.

**SOUTHEAST:** Cold wave and rain then clearing and warming, some scattered showers.

**MIDWEST:** Cold and mostly clear, rain and freezing rain east, warming then colder with showers, snow north.

**NORTHWEST:** Showers and seasonable clearing then colder, rain, snow mountains.

**SOUTHWEST:** Sunny and warm, some showers, mountains then cold, rain and snow mountains, clear California.

EARTHWISE

Many popular houseplants have been found to cleanse the air of toxins and pollution. Some of the most effective plants and the substances they remove are: Aloe vera (many toxins), English ivy (benzene), Ficus or fig trees (formaldehyde), potted chrysanthemum (general pollution, many toxins), and spider plants (formaldehyde). Be careful to hang the English ivy out of reach of small children and pets, as its leaves can be toxic themselves if ingested.

EASY POT ROAST

- 1 3-pound chuck roast
  - 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
  - 1 cup chopped onion
  - 1 cup catsup
  - 1/2 cup Worcestershire sauce
  - 2 tablespoons brown sugar
  - 2 tablespoons cider vinegar
  - 1 teaspoon salt
- Brown roast in hot oil in a Dutch oven. Remove and set aside. Sauté onion in pan drippings until translucent. Return meat to pan. Combine remaining ingredients and pour over the roast. Cover tightly and simmer for 2 to 3 hours or until meat is tender.
