Wednesday, November 17, 1993
 Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was seasonally light to very light. Seller offerings varied, but where extra product was available it was difficult to place. Live supplies were generally moderate. Weights were desirable to heavy. Processing schedules continued to be curtailed, and were just moderate today. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 51 to 63 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to weak. In the parts complex, supplies were irregularly balanced; however, breast items were readily available and slow in clearing. Wings were held with confidence at most plants. Leg items ranged balanced to heavy.

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged. The trade sentiment ranged steady to instances fully steady. Movement of cartoned eggs into retail channels was fair to good with the best call where features were in progress or planned. Supplies were in good balance in all areas of the country except

fully adequate on the West Coast. In the Central States the market for breaking stock was unsettled. Buyers were cautious with most out of the market. Trading was very light with too few sales to report prices on next run product. Sales of finished product was slow. The undertone was weak. In the Southeast, sales of light type hens were at unchanged prices. Offerings were in close balance with next week's reduced processing schedules. Sales of finished product were fairly good. The undertone was steady.

 Trucklot buying interest was very light but seasonal. Supplies of boneless skinless breasts were fully adequate. Trading was reported at lower trending prices and some buyers were simply not interested in breast cutlets at any price. Line run breasts were fully adequate to ample and offered at sharply lower asking prices. Most buyers accepted regular commitments but were out of the market for any additional product. Yellow skin whole legs and leg quarters were irregularly distributed but were at least adequate at most points. Wings were tight.
