THE CHINA CLIPPER

n. November 22, 1935, over 20,000 people watched as the China Clipper left San Francisco for the first official trans-Pacific airmail flight. The plane, a Pan American Martin 130 "flying boat" powered by four Pratt and Whitney Twin Wasp engines, was piloted by Captain Edwin Musick on its 8,000-mile journey. Carrying over 100,000 letters and official mail, the Clipper made stops in Honolulu, Midway, Wake, and Guam before landing in Manila seven days later. National excitement over this historic flight was wellexpressed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt, who remarked to the postmaster-general, "Even at this distance I thrill at the wonder of it all.
