to Mexico seriously limits our ability to profit from this trade. "Nevertheless, increased exports from Southwestern dairies will put an upward pressure on milk prices throughout the United States, so Pennsylvania farmers also will benefit from NAFTA," Hallberg said. "The United States will probably never be a major dairy exporter. We could produce enough to increase exports, but we can't

compete in foreign markets with other major traders which can produce milk at a lower cost, such as New Zealand," Hallberg said. "While they (the major dairy exporting countries affected by GATT) make it difficult for us to compete on the world market, those countries don't produce enough milk to satisfy the U.S. market, so they'll never drive the United States out of the dairy business."

J&J Lawn Care, a business that allows him to combine his interest in mechanics and love of working outdoors. To recognize his accomplishments as an entrepreneur, the National FFA Organization named Cole as the 1993 American Star in Agribusiness.

Cole started his lawn care business during his junior year of high school, almost by accident. He was raising rabbits, but decided to find a more profitable and interesting career area. "While I was looking for this dream job, my folks' lawn needed mowing, and so did my grandparents' and some neighbors'. The first thing I knew I had a small lawn care business without knowing it," Cole said. "I found that I liked that kind of work and it actually fit my employment goals perfectly."

Cole moved quickly to expand his business, and soon had more work than he and his lawn mower could handle. He invested in more equipment and hired a part-time employee. In two years, his staff has grown to three full-time employees to handle the workload. Advertising in area newspapers helps add new clients, but Cole

has found that satisfied customers are his most effective form of advertisement. "The little extras are what I think make my lawn care business thrive," Cole said. He always spends a few additional minutes trimming and cleaning up, which ensures a steady supply of satisfied clients.

Ron Dickens, Liberal FFA Chapter advisor, isn't surprised by Cole's success. "During Jeff's high school years, if his class or any other group had a fund-raiser, Jeff was always the lead salesman by a long shot. His talent carried over into his business," Dickens said.

After graduating from high school, Cole decided to develop his warm weather business into a year-round vocation. He expanded his services to include lawn renovation, tree and shrub planting and rimming, and snow removal.

Cole, the son of Wiley and Thelma Cawyer, plans to continue expanding his lawn care services and upgrading his equipment to better serve his customers. His goal is to construct a greenhouse in order to supply his own plants or landscaping projects.

Sheep, Lamb Marketing Program To Continue

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — State Agriculture Secretary Boyd E. Wolff has announced the results of the referendum to continue the Pennsylvania Sheep and Lamb Marketing Program. The referendum period was held from November 1 to November 15.

"The independent Teller Committee counted 312 votes in favor of the program out of 536 total votes submitted," Wolff said. "We're very pleased that a majority of Pennsylvania's sheep and lamb producers voted to continue this important program."

Any Pennsylvania sheep or lamb producer with at least one animal was eligible to vote on the referendum. As a result of the referendum's approval, the Sheep and Lamb Marketing Program will continue for another five years.
