DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED TO RECEIVE SUPPORT FROM EXPORT SALES AND INCREASED WHEAT EXPORT INSPECTION FIGURES. CORN PRICES ARE MIXED, MOSTLY LOWER DUE TO PROFIT TAKING AND EXPORT DISAPPOINTMENT. SLIGHT GAINS WERE MADE IN SOYBEAN PRICES AFTER MONDAY'S WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION FIGURES WERE HIGHER-THAN-EXPECTED. WHEAT MOSTLY 2 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. CORN MIXED. SORGHUM MIXED. SOYBEANS 2 TO 9 CENTS HIGHER. STRONGER WHEAT PRICES AGAIN TODAY WERE DUE TO THE REPORTED SALE OF 100,000 TONNES OF U.S. WHEAT TO FORMER USSR AND IDEAS THAT EGYPT WILL TENDER FOR U.S. WHEAT SOON. WHEAT EXPORT INSPECTIONS WERE HIGHER THAN EXPECTED LAST WEEK, ADDING TO HIGHER PRICES. CORN PRICES CONTINUED TO WEAKEN AS PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD AND LACK OF EXPORT NEWS WEIGHED ON PRICES. COLD, SNOWY CONDITIONS ARE FORECAST FOR MIDWEST AREAS THIS WEEK AND COULD DAMAGE STANDING CORN. BEAN PRICES REGAINED SOME OF YESTERDAY'S LOSSES BASED ON THE HIGHER-THAN-EXPECTED WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION FIGURE RELEASED MONDAY. SOME EXPORT BUSINESS FROM RUSSIA FOR SOYBEAN MEAL IS STILL POSSIBLE.

Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 50 to 63 cents. Trade sentiment was at least steady. In the parts complex, breangs were adequate and clearing well.

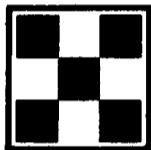
