Mercer 4-H members were honored for service to the various county 4-H clubs, according to Beth Lair, 4-H extension agent.

The Good Housekeeping Award and Clean Up Contest Award went to Cottontail Friends.

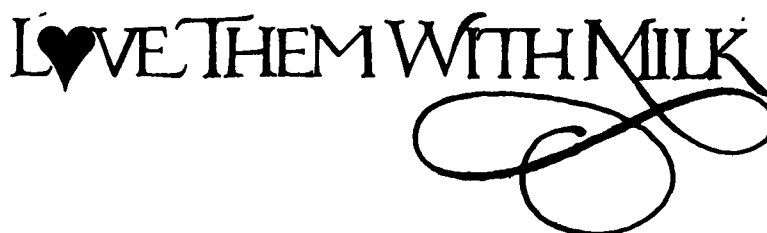

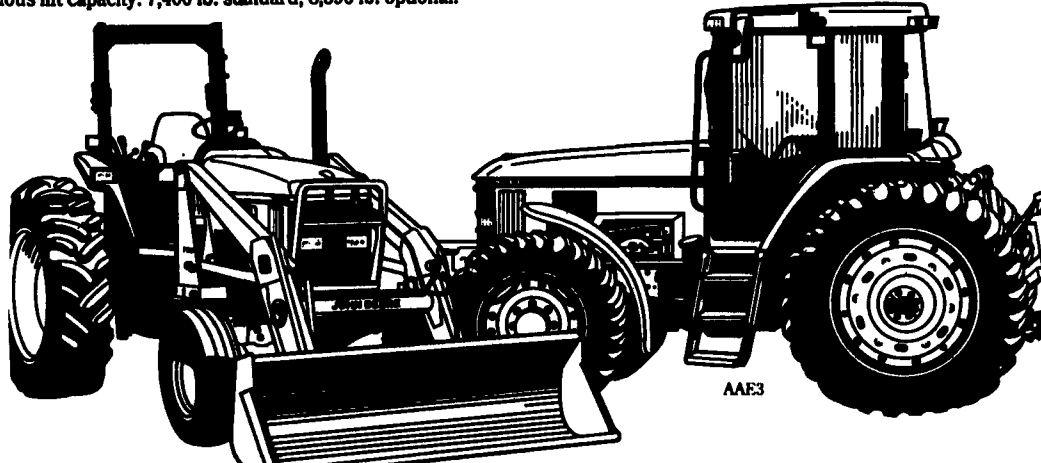
