**THE NOBLE EXPERIMENT**

December 5 marks the 60th anniversary of the end of Prohibition. Although the "Noble Experiment" had high ideals, it spawned an entirely new breed of criminal — the bootlegger. Speakeasies replaced saloons and vast criminal networks developed to support the illegal activities. With fortunes at stake, gang warfare and killings became the rule. Al Capone, the alleged boss behind Chicago's St. Valentine's Day Massacre in 1929, made about \$60 million annually during his heyday. Public opinion turned in favor of repeal as the economic strains of the Depression wore on. Even staunch defenders of Prohibition such as John D. Rockefeller Jr. and S. S. Kresge withdrew their support when they considered the tax revenues that were being lost.

Boil potato and carrot peelings in your teakettle to remove lime buildup.

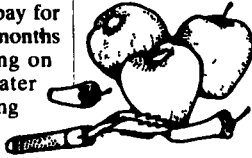
**EARTHWISE**

A good low-flow showerhead can reduce water use by 50%, save you energy dollars, and deliver an invigorating shower as well. Now that's a bargain at any price, so don't try to cut corners by using a "flow restrictor" or cheaper plastic showerhead — they won't deliver the shower you want. According to the Natural Resources Defense Council a good low-flow showerhead will pay for itself in less than six months to one year depending on how you heat your water (and how long you sing in the shower!).

**HOT CABBAGE-APPLE SLAW**

- 3 cups shredded cabbage
- 3 tablespoons cider vinegar
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 2 1/2 tablespoons butter
- 2 teaspoons minced tarragon
- salt and pepper to taste
- 2 medium apples, grated

Wash cabbage and put in a 2-quart saucepan along with vinegar, sugar, butter, tarragon, and salt and pepper. Bring to a boil, then stir in the apples. Cook until apples are hot.


