

PFGC Elects 1994 Officers

WEST MIDDLESEX, (Mercer Co.) — The 1994 officers and directors of the Pennsylvania Forage and Grassland Council were elected at the Annual Forage Conference on Nov. 23.

The PFGC rotates the office of president and vice-president between the three groups of scientist/educators, farmers, and industry.
