CHARLOTTE HALL, Md. — A new alternative agriculture grant program has been established to help southern Maryland farmers learn more about alternative agriculture enterprises that may be feasible in this region. Its goal is to inform producers about alternative agriculture production techniques and to determine the feasibility of alternative crops and enterprises.

extension service agent/specialist within the southern Maryland region is eligible to submit a proposal. Alternative agriculture project areas include aquaculture, crops, floriculture, forestry, horticulture, livestock, turf production, seminars, networking groups, and marketing or feasibility studies.

Any farmer or cooperative

Grant requests may be made for costs associated with any alternative agriculture project, including research trials, demonstration plots, farm field days, informational workshops or meetings, surveys, etc. Grant funds may be used to pay for any supplies and/or hired labor needed to perform and complete the proposed project. Grant funds may not be used for reimbursement of the project leader's own labor, land, and/or equipment.

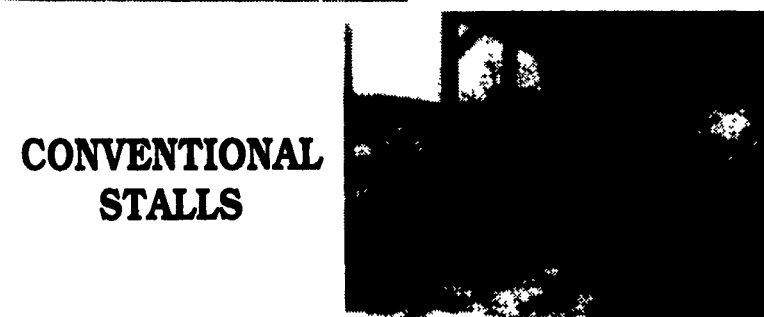
