SOME INTER-DEALER INQUIRY FOR CURRENT TRADING WENT UNFILLED PARTICULARLY DUE TO SELLERS HOLDING EGGS WITH CONFIDENCE AND HIGHER ASKING PRICES. A EXTRA LARGE .65-.70, A LARGE .63-.68, A MEDIUM .54-.57.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was about moderate. Seller offerings ranged adequate to fully adequate. Live supplies were moderate; weights were desirable, occasionally light. Processing schedules varied, but remained very heavy in total. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 50 to 62 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, wings were short of an active call. Legs and leg quarters were adequate, instances tight. Drums and thighs were in fairly good balance. Bone-in breasts were generally easy to place. Boneless skinless breasts remained fully adequate, but in better balance than yesterday.

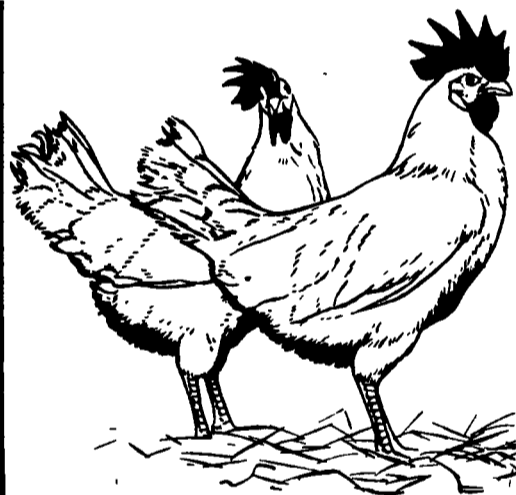
