# Alternative Ag Enterprise Conference Set

WILKES-BARRE (Luzerne Co.) - Jack Moulton, rural development agent for Penn State Cooperative extension in Lackawanna and Luzerne counties. announced that the first annual Northeastern Pennsylvania Alternative Agricultural Enterprise Conference will be held on February 12 at the Pittston Convention Center in Pittston.

He said the purpose of the conference is to provide information on how to make sound decisions before spending large sums of financial investment.
