Ag Secretary Testifies On Future Of Foreign Ag

ANNAPOLIS, Md. — Maryland Secretary of Agriculture Robert L. Walker was the lead witness before the U.S. House Subcommittees on Foreign Agriculture and Government Operations conducting hearings on the future of the Foreign Agriculture Service (FAS).

As a strong proponent of the international marketing of U.S. agricultural products, Walker emphasized that FAS must become more aggressive in helping U.S. companies market high-value processed food products.

"There are three major growing markets in the world in Mexico and Latin America, East Asia, and the former Soviet Union that want U.S. agricultural products. In or-

der to take advantage of this opportunity, FAS must develop a value-added products division that focuses its entire energy on consumer oriented products. In addition, Fas must develop new systems for distributing trade information to U.S. exporters electronically," Walker said.

"We are poised on an extremely exciting time. We are the leading food producer in the world and everywhere you turn there are growing consumer markets eager for what we produce. FAS must help U.S. companies position themselves to take advantage of the tremendous economic opportunities now before us. We cannot afford to sit back and allow this vast agricultural marketplace to slip away," said Walker.
