The reserve junior champion and reserve champion heifer was the overall reserve champion female exhibited by Ellis Farms, Chrisman, Ill. Junior member Curt Stockdale, Dayton, Pa., won the cow-calf division with his pair that included CS Miss 1st Flag 21A and her April heifer calf.
