

Goat Product Marketing Group Organizes

STATE COLLEGE (Centre Co.) — Several people met on November 8 in State College to dis-

cuss the need for an organization devoted to the promotion and marketing of products from goats in

Pennsylvania.

The recent opening market for fluid goat milk in the state, as well

as the growing export market for dairy goats, prompted the interest in an organization which could coordinate the expanding markets for all goat products.

The purpose of the proposed Pennsylvania Caprine Products Association would be to provide a network for those who produce, market, promote, and have an interest in Pennsylvania caprine products. This association would be in direct support of any Pennsylvanian who is involved in, or has an interest in, the process and/or production of caprine products.

These caprine products would include, but not be limited to goat meat, fluid milk and milk products, hides, cosmetics such as soap, fiber, and providing goats

for blood products research and export.

An organizational meeting is planned for 10:30 a.m. on January 16 at the Days Inn, 240 S. Pugh Street, State College. Sunday brunch will be available at a cost of \$8.25 and all people interested in or producing or processing a product from goats in Pennsylvania are invited to attend.

Forest Wetland BMPs Handbook Available

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Co.) — The free pocket guide "Best Management Practices for Silvicultural Activities in Pennsylvania's Forest Wetlands" now is available from Penn State Cooperative Extension offices, Pennsylvania Bureau of Forestry district offices and regional wood industry groups.

The guide is published by the Pennsylvania Forest Issues Working Group, which includes representatives from industry, government, public-interest groups, and educational institutions.

"The guide is intended for field use by foresters, loggers, landowners and other forest land managers," says Dr. Stephen Jones, associate professor of forest resources. "Its 64 pages include helpful guidelines and illustrations. We're establishing a statewide distribution network to ensure that it gets to those who need it."

The first section reviews the functions and values of wetlands and describes the basic characteristics of the four most common types of forest wetlands in Pennsylvania: temporary ponds, spring seeps, streamside wetlands and beaver ponds.

Listed are common plant and soil indicators and other clues signaling the presence of wetlands. Also covered are techniques for developing wetlands and buffer zones and conducting pre-harvest evaluations.

Section two outlines federal and state regulations relating to Pennsylvania wetlands, focusing mainly on Chapter 25 of the Pennsylvania Code, which covers

dam safety and waterway management rules and regulations.

"We included a table summarizing activities covered by Chapter 25 as well as those not covered," Jones said. "Also reviewed are waivers, general permits, small project permits and joint permit applications."

Section three summarizes the recommended best management practices (BMPs) for operating in wetlands. "This is the heart of the guide," Jones said. "It presents a detailed list of recommendations and discusses BMPs and their relationship to wetland regulations and government guidelines concerning erosion and sedimentation pollution control."

"The BMPs listed relate to using haul roads, skid trails and landings, felling trees and establishing buffer zones. The section also identifies BMPs that are conditions of various general permits."

Six appendices provide a checklist for wetlands protection on timber harvesting sites, names of the most common Pennsylvania wetlands plants, important provisions of the Clean Water Act, addresses and phone numbers of federal, state and local contacts, a list of references and a glossary.

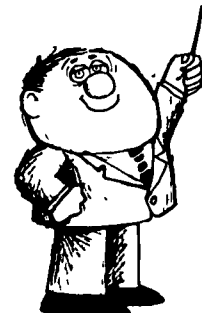
