Committee Has Applications For Beef Expo Junior Show, Scholarships

PORT MATILDA (Centre Co.) — The Pennsylvania Beef Expo Committee has applications available for the 1994 Pennsylvania Junior Cattleman's Association Beef Expo Preview shows.

The junior show will be held on Sunday, April 10, with heifers shown at 9 a.m. and the steer show beginning at 10 a.m. Junior cattle should arrive the afternoon of Saturday, April 9. The 1994 Beef Expo will be held Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, April 8-10 at the Farm Show Building in Harrisburg.

This will be the Fourth annual Steer and Heifer Preview Show sponsored by the Pennsylvania Cattleman's Association. This youth event has become increasingly more popular with Pennsylvania junior cattlemen. Heifer classes will be available for heifers born between April 1, 1992 and October 1, 1993. Heifers will be shown by breeds. There will also be a class for crossbred breeding heifers.

The junior steer show is scheduled for 10 a.m., Sunday, April 10, with six, nine or 12 weight classes, depending on the number of entries. Steers will be weighed in between 5 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 9.

Complete materials regarding the 1994 Beef Exposition, including all of the information and forms of the junior preview shows, will be available at the Pennsylvania Cattleman's Association exhibit in the Beef Barn at the 1994 Pennsylvania Farm Show, Harrisburg, January 3-13.

There will be several other special youth activities beginning at 8 a.m. on Saturday, April 9 and continuing through the next day. These activities will include an obstacle course, a Skillathon, and several other educational and skill requiring events. Entries for contestants in the junior activities will be available on an individual and team basis. Cash awards will be given for both the junior preview shows as well as the junior team and individual events.
