Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was mixed and irregular. Seller offerings varied, but were in fairly good balance overall. Live supplies were moderate. Weights were desirable, instances heavy. Processings schedules originally set to run full at most plants have been disrupted by adverse weather conditions, and are now very light in total. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 51 to 63 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. In the parts complex, breast items remained readily available. Wings were short. Leg items were at least adequate.


