Trucklot buying interest was quite irregular and centered around needs for deliveries following the holiday. Supplies of boneless skinless breasts were irregularly distributed. Smaller volumes traded at the 1.75 level; larger volumes were booked at 1.70 and additional grade A product was available at 1.70. Some buying interest for next week went unfilled.

Line run breasts were readily available, offered at lower prices and slow to clear the market. Most trades were at the 76-77 cent level. Dark meat items cleared at steady prices. Wings were short of trade needs, demand went unfilled, and prices trended higher.

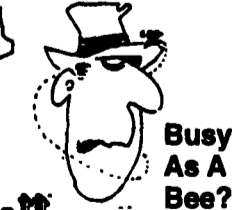
