This involved switching from two 9-hour to three 8-hour shifts and adding a \$2.66 "profit sharing" bonus for all male employees age 22 or older, employed for at least six months, and who were "clean, sober, and industrious." To certify the last requirement, Ford created the "Sociological Department," whose job was to visit homes, interview wives and neighbors, and ask personal questions that wouldn't be tolerated today. But in those days, \$5 a day was a lot of money!

PINEAPPLE BETTY

% cup light brown augar 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind 1% teaspoons cinnamon 15 graham crackers, crumbl 3 cups diced canned pineapple

nombine sugar, rind, and cinnamon. Spread one Uthird of the crackers in a greased 1-quart casserole; add half the pineapple. Top with half the sugar mixture. Add another layer of crackers, then remaining pineap-ple. Combine remaining

cracker crumbs and sugar mixture; sprinkle over pineapple. Dot with butter. Bake at 400° F until the top is brown and crusty.


