Beford County, where hes has served as the chapter's chaplain for a year and as its teasurer for two years.


His FFA activities include beef, swin, lamb, and showmanship and fitting projects and contests and membership in the Limousin Association and the Maine-Anjou Association.

He said he intends to take over his father's farm and eventually increase the size of the beef cattle herd.



the Farm Show, forestry contests, and fruit sales. He has also earned his Star Chapter Farmer Degree.


