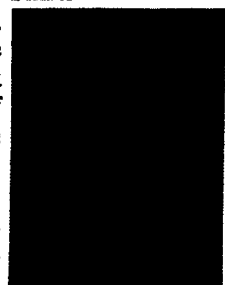
### Bradley M. Shaffer

### Jennifer Shultz

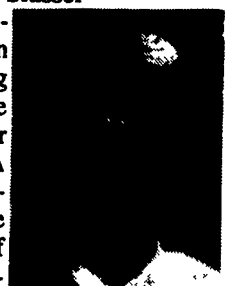
