Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was moderate to good. Offerings were limited on 3 pound and lighter weights; fully adequate on the heavier sizes. Live supplies were moderate; weights were often heavier than desired. Processing schedules remained very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 64 cents. Trade sentiment was at least steady In the parts complex, supplies of bone-in breasts and wings were in close balance to short. Leg items were irregularly balanced; however, most sellers noted improved or generally good clearances.
