His agricultural experience has been with beekeeping and research with computers and Chile. He has also worked at the Dave Lucas broiler and veal calf farm.


With his chapter, he has served on a variety of committees and has been active in a number of other organizations, including the golf team to the Pine Grove Youth Fellowship.

Shane Conaway showed champion Suffolk ewe at the


