OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Compared to last week: Feeder steers and steer calves steady. Feeder heifers and heifer calves steady to \$2.00 higher, those under 700 lbs. at the advance. Demand good in active trading. Quality of supply remains average to attractive. Flesh conditions of feeders average to moderately fleshy and slightly improved from last week. Weigh conditions continue average to gaunt. Bulk supply mainly feeders off wheat. Light supply of calves; these in full flesh range of thin and hard to fairly soft and moderately fleshy. Slaughter cows steady to \$1.00 lower. Slaughter bulls steady to \$.50 lower. Receipts this week 13,500; last week 9,417; last year 7,962. Supply consisted of 73 percent yearlings and few calves over 600 lbs.; 23 percent calves under 600 lbs.; 4 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.

Would you like to raise beef cattle in existing facilities?

Dairy beef cattle perform well when you avoid extremes in temperature and moisture. A little planning and \$300-\$1,200 can turn many existing facilities into a protected, dry pen: Maximum weight gain and minimal labor are the result.




Find a well drained location which lets steers find dry ground in any weather. An unheated, 3-sided machine shed or barn stalls converted to a pen are ideal.




Give them 25-30 sq. ft. per head including water source and bulk feeder (if used). Best choice is feed and water close to shed/barn to encourage "all-weather eating."

Let steers eat with wide enough feeder or bunks. Their only job is to eat—don't make it hard for animals to punch in for work.



Make gate handy for truck access: Come marketing time, you'll be glad you did. With multiple pens, give each its own gate.



Keep the draft off by covering any large holes with sheet metal or plywood. Allow steers to move freely with a double-wide outside entrance.
