GRADUATION DAY

On January 23, 1849, Elizabeth Blackwell graduated at the head of her class and became the first woman in the U. S. to receive a medical degree. Elizabeth applied to twenty-nine schools before being accepted at Geneva College (later part of Syracuse University), and they admitted her only after polling the other students! After admission, her uphill battle continued as she was ostracized by students and the public, and she had to fight for permission to attend anatomy classes. As she later wrote, "The idea of winning a doctor's degree gradually assumed the aspect of a great moral struggle." It was a struggle Dr. Blackwell won not only for herself, but also for the dedicated women who followed.

Can automobiles get any more fuel efficient without sacrificing safety and affordability? Maybe today's cars can't, but that doesn't have to be true of tomorrow's cars. GM and others are working on an ultralight hybrid vehicle utilizing a molded body of composite materials (like those found in some golf clubs and Stealth bombers) and powered by a 10 to 20 horsepower hybrid electric drive. These supercars will be ultraefficient and ultra-safe but also comfortable and beautiful.

HERB-MUSTARD CHICKEN BREASTS

- 2 whole chicken breasts, halved
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons mustard
- 2 tablespoons vinegar
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons grated onion
- 2 teaspoons dried parsley
- 1/4 teaspoon saffron

Place chicken in baking pan; brush with oil. Bake at 425° F for 30 minutes or until browned. Reduce heat to 300° F, brush chicken with more oil, and bake 15 minutes more. Combine remaining oil with other ingredients and pour over chicken. Bake 20 minutes, basting often, until tender.

Makes 4 servings.

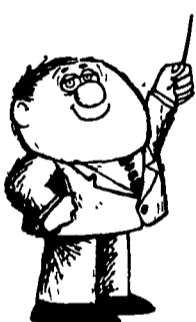

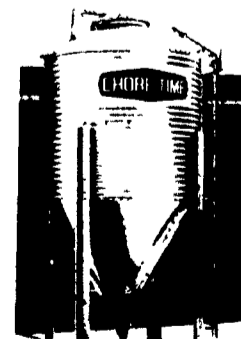
