n January 23, 1849, Elizabeth Blackwell graduated at the head of her class and became the first woman in the U.S. to receive a medical degree. Elizabeth applied to twentynine schools before being accepted at Geneva College (later part of Syracuse University), and they admitted her only after polling the other students! After admission, her uphill battle continued as she was ostracized by students and the classes. As she later wrote, "The idea of winning a doctor's degree gradually assumed the aspect of a great moral strug-



gle." It was a struggle Dr. Blackwell won not only for herself, but also for the dedicated women who followed.
