## Agriculture Day To Focus On New Uses.

ST. LOUIS, Mo. — Corn, wheat, soybeans, and other crops are more than just food. They are staples for consumer products such as biodegradable plastic, cosmetics, and ink. The accomplishments of these alternative uses for agricultural products will take center stage during National Agriculture Day 1994, according to an announcement made at the New Uses Council's annual

"National Ag Day helps bridge the gap between consumers and producers through two-way communication. By listening and responding to consumers' needs, agriculture will continue to improve. New uses are a direct response to consumers' environmental concerns, and National Agriculture Day provides an opportunity to tell this important story," said Wm. Patrick Nichols, president of the Agriculture Council of America.

Jeff Gain, chairman of the NUC, said, "abundant traditional crops, and a variety of nontraditional crops, can be used to their full potential, replacing nonrenewable resources with renewable environment-friendly ones. Corn, for example, is already being used to make fuel and biodegradable plastics. We're excited that National Agriculture Day will focus on these important achievements and help educate consumers about agriculture's ever-changing role in society."
