## Weather, Soil Work To Provide, Champion Tobacco

LANCASTER (Lancaster Co.) Simply put, growing good tobacco depends on the best soil and weather — and a Strasburg area farmer insists he's got the best of both.

Donald M. Rohrer, who lives near Strasburg, picked up grand champion smoking tobacco last week at the Lancaster County tobacco show.

Rohrer, who grows about five acres of tobacco, said the sandyloam soil he grows his tobacco on provides a good, light crop. Rohrer indicated that a former tobacco show judge once said some of the best tobacco in Lancaster comes from the soil of Strasburg, which is rich in nutrient-holding mica.

Rohrer repeated as champion from last year, and has won about 10 championships out of the last 15: He said he intends to gradually cut back on growing tobacco as he nears retirement.

Todd M. Rohrer, Strasburg, won grand champion Pa. Type 41 tobacco at the show.

Lancaster County Ag Agent Bob Anderson said that this year has been a good growing year for

tobacco. Anderson said he was surprised that there have been fewer disease and insect problems in growing tobacco than the county has seen in the past.

## Pork Congress Sets Junior Speaking Contest

There are three age divisions,





Program To Air will prepare producers for Pork Quality Assurance Level III certification.

The program is made possible by the National Pork Board in association with the National Pork Producers Council (NPPC) and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Producers, veterinarians, and industry experts will take part in a review of Levels I & II, the 10 Critical Control Points in Level III, an overview of federal recordkeeping regulations, and yearly recertification information. The satellite broadcast will feature a new video incorporating many practical on-farm applications of Level III. Viewers may call in their questions to a panel during the program by calling (800) 755-7765.

To find the nearest satellite site, pork producers may contact their local veterinarian, county extension office, or county or state pork producer association. Satellite coordinates may be obtained from NPPC after February 1 by calling (800) 456-7675. The program is available on either C-band or Kuband.
