## **Pork Producers Invest In Industry's Future**

DES MOINES, Iowa - The nation's pork producers are investing more than \$38 million this year in programs to strengthen the position of pork in the marketplace and to expand and develop markets for pork products in this country and foreign markets. Money for pork promotion, research, and consumer information programs comes from a national legislative checkoff program that started in 1986. Producers selling breeding stock, feeder pigs or market hogs, as well as importers of hogs and pork products, contribute .35 of one percent of the market value (35 cents per \$100 value) to the checkoff program.
