CASH WHEAT PRICES ARE MIXED, WEDNESDAY, CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES FELL MOD-ERATELY LOWER. IMPROVED EXPORT DEMAND AND GOOD CASH DEMAND BOOSTED WHEAT PRICES BUT NOT MUCH MOVING DUE TO INCREMENT WEATHER. FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD AND OUTLOOK FOR IMPROVED WEATHER IN MIDWEST AREAS TOWARD WEEK'S END ADDED PRESSURE TO GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES WHEAT MIXED FROM 3 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER TO 2 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. CORN 2 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 9 TO 11 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 5 CENTS LOWER EXPORT SALES IMPROVED SLIGHTLY FOR WHEAT TODAY AND SOME TECHNICAL BUYING ON THE BOARD SUPPORTED PRICES A WARMING TREND IS FORECAST FOR MIDWEST AREAS BY THIS WEEKEND AND PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD LIMITED WHEAT GAINS CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED THEIR DOWNWARD SLIDE DUE TO FUND SELLING AND REPORTS FOR IMPROVED WEATHER CONDITIONS. WARMER WEATHER CONDITIONS WILL ALLOW RIVER TRAFFIC TO RESUME IN THE MIDWEST. FOREIGN DEMAND REMAINS VERY LIGHT THIS WEEK.
