

# Wenger Announces Re-Election Bid

## Wyoming County To Hold Lambing School

TUNKHANNOCK (Wyoming Co.) — The annual Mid-Winter Lambing School, sponsored by the Wyoming County Sheep and Wool Producers Association (PDA), will be held at the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture building in Tunkhannock on Saturday morning, January 29, from 9:30 A.M. until 11:30 A.M.

The PDA building is located on Highway Rt. 92 adjacent to Barton John Deere and Campos Trucking.

The program has been developed to meet the needs of novice and experienced shepherds and is open to sheep farmers throughout the entire area.

The 1994 curriculum will center on the role of the ewe with focus on health maintenance, disease prevention, diagnosis and treatment, and flock management.

The program will begin promptly at 9:30 a.m. with a video, "Introduction To Flock Health." This is a "Winrock International" production and made available for this occasion by the department of animal science of Penn State.

Dr. D'Alessandro's topic, "Metabolic diseases," will zero in on such problems as white muscle disease, pregnancy toxemia, hypocalcemia, and other disorders associated with the lambing ewe. Increasingly restrictive FDA regulations and scrutiny make it imperative that producers keep informed about approved preventive and treatment measures. The format will be interactive, with ample opportunity for questions and audience participation.

Up-to-the-minute information concerning Green Valley Lamb, Pennsylvania lamb marketing cooperative, will also be available at this meeting. This promising new venture has been born out of two years of intensive study, producer surveys, and market research by a committee appointed by the Pennsylvania Sheep and Lamb Marketing Board. The goal is to provide a structure through which lamb producers can market lambs in a more advantageous and profitable manner than through the conventional system.

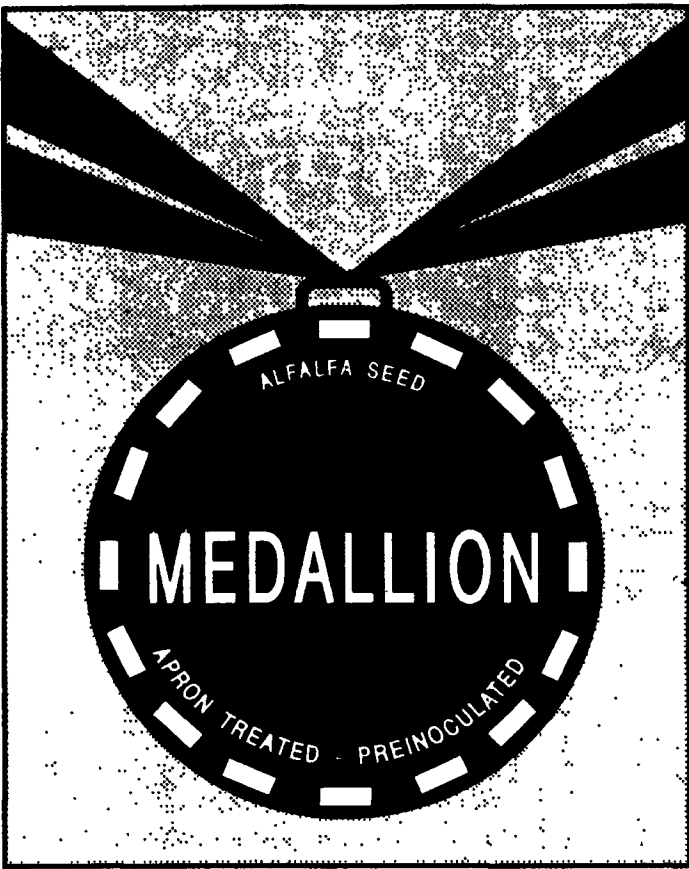
