> Students will learn that corn is a reservoir of energy and a renewable substitute for anything made from expendable fossil fuels. With comic-book hero, Captain Cornelius, as guide, students will learn that corn is no longer used just for food and animal feed. Today, it can be found in everything from fuels to pharmaceuticals.

"By providing this informative educational kit, NCGA is expected to strengthen the ties between agriculture, specifically corn, and future consumers and leaders. And in the long run that will be good for corn farmer profitability," Kay said.
