ing, controlled traffic, and earthworms can all play a role in managing and correcting compaction.

Reeder has been doing research and extension programs on the problems related to excessive soil compaction for 10 years. He is co-author of a recently published article, "Subsoil Compaction By Vehicles With High Axle Load — Extent, Persistence, and Crop Response," which summarizes research from around the world.

Several new regulations and pieces of legislation are coming out of Washington that may have an impact on the way we grow corn in Pensylvania.

Examples of these would be the reauthorization of the Clean Water Bill, Coastal Zone Management (yes Pennsylvania is considered in the coastal zone), and the Wellhead Protection Program. Corn growers need to be more aware of these and the potential impact on their operation.




