CORN PRICES HELD FIRM AS EX- PORT DEMAND IMPROVED AND REPORTS RIVER TRAFFIC STILL A PROBLEM. SOY-BEAN PRICES STRONGER DUE TO LIMITED FARMER SELLING AND LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND. WHEAT 3 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO UP 2 CENTS. SORG-HUM UNCHANGED TO 5 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. WINTER WHEAT AREAS RECEIVED BENEFICIAL RAINFALL AS TEMPERATURES WARMED UP EARLY THIS WEEK. CORN PRICES WERE UNCHANGED BUT A STRONG UNDERTONE PREVAILED. EXPORT SALES IMPROVED AND BARGE MOVEMENT OF GRAINS STILL A PROBLEM. 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
