

# Tree Seedling Cost Sharing Available

Now is the time to plan for tree planting to be done in the spring of 1994. The Glatfelter Pulp Wood Company, Spring Grove, Pennsylvania, will once again share the cost of tree seedlings with interested landowners. Since the inception of the company program in 1951, more than 19 million seedlings have been furnished to landowners in these south central Pennsylvania counties: Adams, Berks, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Huntingdon, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Mifflin, Northumberland, Perry, Schuylkill, Snyder and York.

Pennsylvania regulations include:  
 ✓ Trees may not be used for Christmas trees, decorative or ornamental uses, or for windbreaks.  
 ✓ The minimum acceptable order is for 500 seedlings which will plant three-quarter of an acre.  
 ✓ All trees become the property of the landowner who may harvest them at a future date for any wood product.

matched until that dollar limit is reached. After that, full payment for orders will be the responsibility of the landowner.

If you are a landowner who is planning to plant trees in 1994, act now! The supply of seedlings is limited.

The Glatfelter program has an overall dollar limitation. Seedling orders will be accepted and

Glatfelter will cover up to one half of the cost of seedlings ordered by non-industrial landowners. Tree seedlings available under this year's program include Virginia pine, Japanese larch, white pine, red pine, white spruce and Norway spruce. All seedlings are furnished by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources. Orders will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

The Glatfelter Pulp Wood Company imposes no restrictions of any kind, but landowners must comply with State regulations regarding the planting of these trees.

As I write this it is snowing heavily, and we're to have snow all day. It reminds me of the day we got married some 40 years ago this month.

We didn't begin to have the toys that many children have today, but we managed to entertain our three little ones with toy machinery, dolls, and books. And, we all had to live in the one warm room. I'm sure that my husband didn't have much fun either as he had to milk all the cows by hand. But, now years later it is just something to talk about when winter comes again.

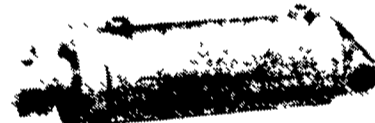
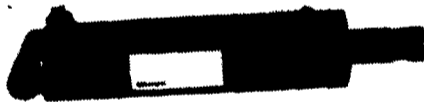
