Supplies of boneless skinless breasts with tenders were irregularly distributed and ranged oversold to available. Trading was reported at 1.85 but some product was offered at competitive prices. Product without tenders was available for immediate delivery and slow to clear. Line run breasts were readily available but most buyers were out of the market until early next week. The trade sentiment was barely steady. Dark meat items were in close balance to tight. Wings improved over prior week and traded at current prices.


