Buying interest was very light due in part to adverse weather throughout the area. Supplies of boneless skinless breasts with tenders were in fairly good balance and traded at the 1.85 level; product without tenders was fully adequate and traded mostly at 1.80. Some heavier boneless skinless was available at lower prices and slow to clear. Line run breasts were in close balance but most buyers were quite selective and current offerings were slow to clear. Some buyers could use product for late week. Dark meat items were well cleared at current prices. Wings continued in close balance but trading was at unchanged prices.
