

Limousin Sale Rockets To \$7,280 Average

ENGLEWOOD, Colo. — Buyers from 12 states and Canada showed their approval of the quality offering in the National Western Limousin Sale January 12 as they powered the sale to a \$7,280 average on 34.16 lots.

C.K. "Sonny" Booth and Bruce Brooks were auctioneers for a sale that found the black and polled cattle meeting with the most intensive bidding — 7.5 black and polled lots averaged \$14,546.

RLJB Extra Spectacular, a 3/3/93 black polled TEXS Ranger Primo son out of HC Extraordinary HCR 61X commanded a \$27,000 bid for three-quarter interest and full possession. The Spectacular Syndicate of the United States and Canada purchased the interest from: Rooney Limousin, Maxwell, Iowa; JD Ranch, Pella, Iowa; and Thunder Farms, Ooltewah, Tenn.

The sale show grand champion, SY Bobbie Jo 326B, drew a final bid of \$25,000 from Yackle-Sugar Maple Leaf Limousin of Onida, S.D. and Millbrook, N.Y. The black polled 8/25/92 daughter of LKCC Tomahawk's Touchdown is out of Miss SY Supercharge 327U and was consigned by Amy Brooks of Marietta, Okla. SY Bobbie Jo was also grand champ-

ion of the National Western Junior Limousin Show.

Willow Grove Limousin of Lafayette, Colo. stopped the bidding at \$18,500 to own half interest in SLVL Black Brandi 13C, a black polled 1/3/93 daughter of NICO Polled Legacy out of SCF Extra Easy 241Y. Sullivan Limousin was the consignor. Black Brandi was reserve champion in Division II of the sale show, behind SY Bobbie Jo.

Johnson's Turkey Creek Ranch of Shawnee, Okla. consigned the highest selling fullblood in the sale. TCR Pharaoh, an 8/25/92

Harvest Olympus son out of SCF Promise Ring 830X brought a \$14,100 bid. For the money, Sunset Valley Limousin of Newalla, Okla. picked up three-quarters interest and full possession of the bull.

McCall Farms of Tijeras, N.M. gave \$11,000 for three-quarters interest and full possession of CLLL Snipes, a black polled 9/28/92 son of LKCC Tomahawk's Touchdown out of Wulf's Black Satin. Circle L Limousin and Land Company of Wadsworth, Ohio was the consignor.

Express Limousin Ranch gave

\$10,750 to own CHR Precious Daisy, a polled 2/24/92 daughter of Mr. SY Power Hitter 313X out of BJCO Yellow Daisy that was consigned by Coyote Hills Ranch, Chattanooga, Okla. The female was Division III reserve champion in the sale show.

Edgemont Limousin of Kiowa, Okla. had the Division I champion in the sale show with EDGE Cheyenne, a 3/12/93 black polled daughter of SY Polled 770W out of PMDB Alliance. Stewart and Son of Chikasha, Okla. purchased the female for \$5,500.

Division I reserve champion in the sale show was Wulf's Colorful 3007C, a 3/3/93 polled daughter of Wulf's Polled Progress out of MCM Fancy CMH 451A. Minerich Land and Cattle Company of Richmond, Ky. gave \$3,900 to own the female.

Rounding out the show winners was Adam Nielson of Arlington, S.D. with the Division III champion and reserve grand champion, ANLR Sweet Success, a 4/1/92 polled daughter of SY Heavy Hitter 313W out of Juel's 546V. Miguel Reece of San Antonio, Texas paid \$3,600 for her.

Wayne County Accepts Ag Applications

HONESDALE (Wayne Co.) — The Wayne County Agricultural Land Preservation Program is accepting applications for the purchase of agricultural/conservation easements on Wayne County farms.

The early application deadline was February 1, and the absolute final deadline is July 1. Area farmers interested in this program are strongly encouraged to submit their applications long before the July 1 deadline.

Agricultural easement values are determined by a qualified ap-

praiser hired by the Wayne County Agricultural Land Preservation Board. The easement value is the difference between the current market value of the farm and the farmland or agricultural value of the farm. All of this information is contained within the farm appraisal. After receiving the agricultural/conservation easement, the farm can continue its normal operation as an active farm producing agricultural products and/or commodities.

To be eligible for the Wayne County Agricultural Land Preser-

vation Program, a farm must be enrolled in an Agricultural Security Area, be capable of generating annual gross farm receipts greater than \$25,000, have at least 50 percent of its soils in capability class 1 to 4, (as defined by the soil surveys published by the United States Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service), contain 50 percent harvested cropland, pasture or grazing lands and if harvested cropland, and be capable of producing sustained yields per acre equal to the county average yield per acre for that crop as published

by the Pennsylvania Agricultural Statistical Service (PASS).

Area landowners selling agricultural/conservation easements during the 1991, 1992, and 1993 programs have agreed to perpetual easements.
